

AUTOMATIC DISQUALIFIERS

Driving Record

- Must not have been at-fault in more than three (3) motor vehicle accidents in the past twenty-four (24) months.
- Must not have been convicted of DWI within the past ten (10) years.
- Must not have been convicted of DWI more than once.
- Must not have been convicted of DWLS within the past two (2) years.
- Must not have been convicted of DWLS more than once.
- Must not have been convicted of Failure to Show Proof of Financial Responsibility (liability insurance) within the past two (2) years or more than once.
- Must not have been convicted of more than three (3) moving violations during the past twelve (12) months.

Criminal

- Must not have been convicted of a Felony or Class A Misdemeanor.
- Must not be on probation for a criminal offense.
- Must not have been convicted of a Class B Misdemeanor within the last ten (10) years.
- Must not have been convicted of a Family Violence related assault.
- Must not have been involved in any undisclosed criminal activity or offenses classified as Class A Misdemeanor or Class B Misdemeanor within the last ten (10) years.

Drugs

- Must not have marijuana or K2 usage within the past (3) three years or (10) times within lifetime.
- Must not have injected any illegal substance listed in the Texas Health and Safety Code without a prescription issued under a valid patient/physician relationship and that drug use was considered necessary for the treatment of an illness.
- Must not have used in any form the following illegal or hallucinogenic drugs in any manner including, but not limited to: meth, crack cocaine, PCP, LSD, heroin.
- Must not have used cocaine within the last (10) years or (3) times within lifetime.
- Must not have used any illegal substance (other than marijuana or K2) for the purpose of intoxication, recreation, or experimentation or any substance listed in the Texas Health and Safety Code without a prescription issued to the applicant under a valid patient/physician relationship, within the past ten (10) years. This includes abusable glues, aerosol paints, or amphetamines (commonly known as speed), etc.
- Must not have ingested, inhaled or introduced into the body in any fashion (other than marijuana or K2) any substance listed in the Texas Health and Safety Code

except under a prescription issued under a valid patient/physician relationship more than ten (10) times and at no time in the past twenty-four (24) months.

- Must not have manufactured or sold any illegal drugs.
- Use of a controlled substance by a youth of 16 years of age or younger will not be considered.

Prior police service

- Must have left previous agency under honorable circumstances
- Must not have history of serious disciplinary action

Military service

- Must not have discharge under anything less than honorable circumstances
- Must not have history of serious disciplinary action
